Inviting

Invite: to request the presence or participation of another person

LEVEL 1 - Movies, dinner, lunch, weddings, birthday parties, etc.

We invite people all the time. It's part of living with others. We invite people to share a meal with us or come for a visit. We invite them to see a new movie or go to eat. We invite for a variety of reasons. Nothing to it.

We invite! What invitations are easy to extend?

LEVEL 2 - Church Activities

Inviting people to a church activity can be more challenging for us. Why do you think this may be true? Don't we think the church activity will be a blessing to that person's life? Perhaps we fear we might impinge on that individual's private faith-life. To a certain degree, this is true, but in a positive way. God blesses people. Hopefully, others might be blessed by the fellowship found at church.

Not everyone is ready to attend a service of worship every Sunday, but inviting someone to one service with special music, children's choir, or drama might be a start. Or, what about extending an invitation to a church potluck dinner? People love good food.

Inviting someone to a church activity doesn't have to be hard. It does involve some risk, but the potential of blessing for that person is significant.

Who in your life would you like to invite to a church activity?

Which activities would that person particularly enjoy?

LEVEL 3 - Faith in Jesus Christ

Our world is full of people hungry for meaning. Many long for someone to help us make sense of the complex puzzle of life. Luther put it something like this, "We are hungry beggars showing other beggars where to find food." Thus, how can we not share our faith and hope in Jesus Christ? There are people who desperately need some good news in their lives.

Let us pray for God to empower us to be clear witnesses to the love of God made known in Christ. May God open our hearts, eyes and mouths to the opportunities to bear witness to Christ. Let us pray for courage to invite, invite and invite.

Who is God bringing to mind for you to witness to God's love?

How might you share the joy and love of Christ?



1 Stewardship

" ... you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." 2 Corinthians 9:7

Share abundantly

as we have received. The purpose of these gifts is for the good of the community of God. We give to build up the body of Christ. We use and share our gifts for the benefit of all.

> "...and God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work." 2 Corinthians 9:8

Give proportionately is our way of giving in relation

to our abundance. We are to give according to our "means," not according to an income or a budget.

> "If the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has-not according to what one does not have," 2 Corinthians 8:12

Commit intentionally means making a state-

ment about your intent and following through. As members in the body of Christ, we are asked to make a commitment of our time, talents, and resources as a faithful response to God and as a statement of support for God's work.

> "...arrange in advance for this bountiful gift that you have promised." 2 Corinthians 9:5



Obey responsibly

to glorify God as a faithful proclamation of God's word. We acknowledge our faith and show our faith in the gospel for the glory of God and for the building up of the body of Christ. This takes courage. It involves our life-long obedience, including the ways we treat our families, others, and ourselves.

> "...you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ." 2 Corinthians 9:13

Give willingly as moved by the Holy Spirit. We have been prepared to give of ourselves. We give our time, talents, and resources freely.

> " For, as I can testify, they voluntarily gave " 2 Corinthians 8:3



Contribute regularly means practicing

our stewardship

on a daily basis. By doing so this becomes a lifestyle. Paul instructs us:

> "On the first day of every week, each of you is to put aside and save whatever extra you earn." 1 Corinthians 16:2







Live genuinely

means putting your faith into action. This is the tangible

demonstration of what is sincerely on our hearts and where our treasure is, not simply a verbal expression. The Macedonians set an example that Paul called to the attention of the Corinthians.

> "I am testing the genuineness of your love against the earnestness of others." 2 Corinthians 8:8

means recognizing the dynamic nature of our faith. As our faith grows so will our blessings, and our responsibilities. Paul writes,

> "...the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully." 2 Corinthians 9:6


