

I pray that we may see the beginning to an after school tutoring program here at Lord of Life. So, starting in mid-January I would like you to bring evidence of this in so we can continue to utilize the netting on the crosses. At the end of this gathering time I pray that the many ways God is present will be evident as we enter this worship space that we are so blessed to have.

Time for beginning our Evangelism into our community is near. Coming soon will be times for sharing our faith stories with each other in a safe space and environment. I will explain this more as time goes on. Last, but certainly not least, I want to give thanks for the Lord of Lifers and Children's choir. If you have been wanting to sing there is no better time then now to join some fantastic servants of God; as they proclaim their love for our Lord through the gift of music. 2009 will see a new time for Sunday school. Our Education hour is now taking place after worship on Sunday mornings. This time is meant for those of all ages. Prayerfully consider what you would like to be involved in. Perspective ...

I spent the afternoon on my laptop, "googling" stuff that piqued my curiosity. I had found a subject rich in internet resources: World Hunger. Try it yourself. For a change from the normal articles and reports on World Hunger, try your search against "Images" or "Videos." What I found kept me busy for hours – especially the Video resources.

I was given a new perspective: my life doesn't look anything like that of millions of people who exist in a world of extreme poverty!

While I was out and about, doing some food shopping for the bible study at my home one night, I ran across an older man who took the time to greet me, "God bless you brother." Gee, I wish I had thought of that! He took the time to remember God in the midst of his busy day – I was too occupied to think of God first.

I was given a new perspective: People I don't even know witness to me all the time. Do others have the same impression of me?

I've heard a ton of excuses by people why they don't tithe; one of those being, they don't make enough to tithe. Then we were treated to a commitment by our young pastor, and his family of five, to increase their tithe from ten to 11%. Pastor's income is pretty much public information (since we vote on it each year.) I know Pastor's income is less than that of most households in our congregation.

Does that bring a new perspective for you?

Funny how an extra \$20 at the gas pump is something we pay and go on about our lives (with little tangible effect on the rest of our needs ;) but, the idea of an extra \$20 in the offering plate each week is considered outrageous!

Is that a new perspective? Isn't it the same \$20? ... of course, God isn't big on "collections" ... or is He?

The economy has affected my Daughter more than most of us. Her employer just cut everyone's rate of pay in order to compensate for increase costs. So, she finds herself doing a very frugal Christmas for herself and her three boys. At first she felt really bad about not being able to give the boys a lot of presents. But as Christmas gets nearer, I find her and the boys with a great celebration attitude as they find other ways to enjoy family while spending minimal dollars for these holidays.

What a great perspective! We don't need to spend money to show our love for each other – rather love really demands we spend <u>ourselves</u> to each other.

If you take the opportunity to read C.S. Lewis' book *The Screwtape Letters*, you will be rewarded with a whole new perspective about life, relationships, Christian beliefs, and walking-thewalk. Each of us is under the impression we are walking a straight path to the Kingdom, while the truth is, that path is rife with curves and turns, speed bumps and detours, obstacles and deadends. We don't all make it.

The study we are now completing on the book has opened my eyes to my own spiritual journey; a new perspective on my own Walk to Emmaus (see Lk 24:13ff).

We are about to witness the inauguration of our first President of color. While I grew up in Northern Illinois all my child years, I had little exposure to what many experienced as racial discrimination. But hey, we were kids, and kids just play together – no matter! Then I spent 20+ years in the Air Force, probably an environment more widely integrated than any other at the time, so I saw few incidences of racial bias during that period. Just because I didn't see it, doesn't mean it wasn't there.

Since Mr. Obama won the election, I have seen a sparkle in the eyes, and a dance in the steps of the black brothers and sisters around me. A whole people seem to have been set free.

I'll be praying for a new perspective by our society in these next years – one that will see our President Obama not as a black man, but as a man.


