

#### Financial Situation Alert for Lord of Life

We are unable to pay our monthly financial obligations without using our reserve funds. Since January of this year we have withdrawn over \$3,000 per month from these funds. Our reserve funds will expire before the end of this summer. Have mercy on us. We have sinned against God in thought, word, and deed by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not trusted God with our whole heart; we have not loved one another in deed and in truth. This congregation needs to be lifted up to grow in Jesus Christ.

We have reduced expenses through cutting salaries, cutting office hours, medical expenses, water usage, and other services like ground maintenance and pest control. We are running out of areas to reduce. We need forgiveness for our failures and a newness of life through Jesus Christ. We need your support of time, talent, and treasures. We know the current time has been tough on many of our members but it has not taken away your talents or time.

We are working with our own financial task force, the company that holds our mortgage, the Pacifica Synod, and others to develop a financial plan that will allow us to continue to live and serve our Lord and Savior. We are developing a capital funds campaign to replenish our reserve funds. We request your prayers that this campaign will be successful and done according to God's will. Prayerfully search your heart for all that you can do in God's name.

### RELAY FOR LIFE 2010 WRAP-UP

This was our tenth year as participants in the Moreno Valley Relay for Life. **Once again, our church team is #1**. On Sunday morning of relay, our initial total was \$8433.00, making us the top money raiser for 2010. Pat Rupert has kept a record of our donations each year and,

going into this year, we had raised over \$92,000.00. Our final donations of over \$9500.00 put us over the \$100K mark. That is quite an accomplishment, Lord of Life! You are awesome!

This was a year of change: a new name, a new banner, a new team captain, a new type of fund raiser, and of course a new theme: "Celebrating more Seasons". There were many people that worked tirelessly behind the scenes: Audrey Flickinger and Becci VanHoosier. Without their help, I could not have done it. Pastor Shane, thank you for the wonderful opening remarks and invocation. Arlene Eder designed the new team banner, "Lord of Life for Love of Life". Diane Combes, Oly Vernlund, Carole Horton, and Jan Egeland assembled our survivor gifts. Maggie August's decorations transformed our booth into an Emerald Isle with shamrocks, leprechauns, rainbows, pots of gold and anything Irish. For all those who came to help decorate our site and clean up on Sunday morning, we thank you.

We took on a new function this year: the Luminaria Booth. This included selling Luminaria for the ceremony, setting them up to be lit for the Luminaria Ceremony and putting the Luminaria program together. We had special readings, songs, a time for remembering, a wonderful bagpiper, Mr. Steve Horton, and some amazing scout troops who lit the luminaria as Steve played and the walkers passed by. A big thank you to Audrey Flickinger and Barbara Shoemaker for coordinating that effort. Thanks to Kyle Freeman for representing his scout troop and filling the bags with sand and a candle. Jack Pavelich asked that the money he raised be added to David's total, which brought it up over \$3200.00. Wendy Eder took up the walk this year and raised over \$660.00. John Lowe had lots of support from teachers with \$500. And we have two young people who took Relay for Life coin cans to school and collected from their schoolmates. Between the two of them, they raised almost \$100.00. Way to go Spencer and Schuyler!

I would be remiss, if I didn't say thanks to all of those who came out and walked, especially during the heat of the day and the wee early hours of the morning. You are wonderful. Thanks also to those who brought food, snacks, water, and ice out to sustain those who spent the 24 hours on the field. We are truly blessed and thankful.

An extra big thank you to Mike for supporting me and putting up with my up and particularly down moments throughout the last six months of planning this function. I don't know what I would do without you!
