

We are hopeful that the nursery will blossom with 0-4 year olds. Our family night dinners prior to Advent and Lenten worship have been successful and we anticipate bible studies/dinner in the future. Our Evangelism Ministry is progressing and the interested members will begin their training soon.

## Nothing to do with money ...

I have this fear that some of you will set this page down without going further than the first few paragraphs – much because you will quickly realize this to be an Old Testament lesson and therefore no longer applicable to God's people because Jesus ushered in a New Covenant. Yes, He did. But might I be so bold to lift up His very words regarding these things: "Do not think that I have come to do away with the Law of Moses and the teachings of the prophets. I have not come to do away with them, but to make their teachings come true." Matt 5:17 GNB

Jesus words point us to the great book of Deuteronomy; a book written mostly by Moses to remind the people what God has done for them so that they might rededicate their lives to Him. And in this book, the 14<sup>th</sup> Chapter, and beginning with the 22<sup>nd</sup> verse, Moses describes why the tithe is so important in the lives of people who claim to be God's people. ... and it has nothing to do with the money!

#### Where's the new Pastor?

Located in a part of the book which Moses uses to describe the laws necessary for proper Worship, the tithe has been put into place in order that we might revere God always. This means that we put Him first. It makes sense. If I put God first in my life wouldn't I give to Him first? And wouldn't what I give to Him be a significant part of me? And if God is first then I can't be ...

When Mary Jean and I were making our Stewardship journey many years ago, my desire was to meet a goal – to achieve a challenge – to do something that I knew was right. Little did I realize during those years how much more important God was becoming in my life. Little did I know or realize at the time that my God was becoming a bigger part of me. During that time, God snuck up and grabbed my heart!

Our scripture points out to us that wherever our treasure is, there our heart will be

also. How right they are. As each moves toward the tithe, we find God becomes more valuable in our lives. He becomes essential to everything that we do. It is the point where we start turning to God as a first resort – rather than as a last resort.

# We're still working on it! Sometimes God needs us to wait...

So, when Jesus promises to "make their teachings come true," He promises to be our ours when we do these things – not because we have done it, but because we have faith that He has chosen us to be His! It has nothing to do with the money – and everything to do with loving God with all our hearts, and all our souls, and all our strength (which also requires us to put Him first.)

God has no need for our money. So money and goods and stuff are not what the tithe is about. Rather, God and Moses reveal our giving to be an expression of where God is in our lives.

Money is so important in the society we live in! It is difficult to swim upstream when the culture around us flows downstream with such a love of money, and possessions, and status which is purchased by the same things. God wants us to be free of that kind of entrapment.

The tithe is something that can set you free; and yes, it really has nothing to do with money.

Amen?

# Lord of Life Lutheran Church will offer Vascular Screenings

Lord of Life Lutheran Church will again host Life Line Screening on Monday, April 14, 2008. Life Line will be screening for blockage in the carotid arteries in the neck (75% of all strokes are linked to carotid artery blockage.) They will also be checking the arteries in the legs for Peripheral Arterial Disease, or PAD, which is linked to heart disease. They offer a third screening that tests for aneurysms in the

aortic vessel in the abdomen and a fourth screening for early detection of osteoporosis.

This is a preventative program for anyone over the age of 40 and it is worth participating in. Your screening results are sent to you within 21 days after they are reviewed by a board certified physician and you are then able to take those results to your own personal physician. These low cost, non-invasive, completely painless screenings take about 10 minutes each. You must pre-register by calling 800-324-1851 for an appointment.
