On November 16th; Spencer and Schuyler Ciasullo will be received as new members as well as having their baptism remembered on this special day. For nearly his entire career with the US government, my husband had a best friend. He was a Turkish man who returned the friendship in all ways. I once asked my husband what was so special about _____. The response came (in a voice that wondered "What kind of a ninny are you that you have to ask that question?") "Why, Bevy, if it came down to two against a thousand, I'd want him to be the other one." I watched the friendship develop for years. It turns out that the friend also felt that "two against a 1000" bond. Whenever the men met, it was always the same greeting; first a gentlemanly handshake followed by a lengthy bear hug with both men pounding on the other's back and making sounds of joyful mirth. The time since their last meeting could be 3 days, 3 months, 3 years or even longer. It was always the same. I often marveled at the mutual respect, loyalty, and integrity those two shared through good and bad! Even when we were at separate locations in the world, those guys held on fiercely to their friendship. A few years after his retirement, my husband died. I thought often about the gaping hole left, not only in my heart, but that of his friend.

I don't know where that "two against a thousand" came from but I venture to say it has affected many more than "a thousand". God must have known that those two men needed each other. He blessed each of them with a loval friend in full view of their peers, their acquaintances, their jobs, and every person that ever saw them together. Admittedly, not all of us develop a friendship like this but most of us will at least witness such a friendship. I see the friendship of these two men reflected in the lives of their families. Not only my life but those of my daughters carry on that blessing. I still think about it every now and then. With time and the grace of God, I have discovered that all friendships are gifts from God. And, even when a very special gift is taken from us, the blessing itself does not end. I no longer believe in coincidence. God puts blessings where they will be a blessing to others. I've seen it with my own eyes and thank God every day for the grace to share them with all of His children. The LLR Saturday afternoon's Women's Group spent some time discussing the need for nurturing friendships. You won't be surprised to hear that

many of you that are reading this article have,

from time to time, become my 'other one'. I can't begin to explain how these friendships have touched my life. I am hopeful that I, too, can be the 'other one' for some of my Lord of Life sisters and brothers. Each of us receives more blessings than we could ever imagine. We receive the blessings that our Lord gives us and the grace to use them in our lives. Praise be to God!

I hear all of you! And I also notice Thrivent seems to be sending out my stock reports more frequently than ever before. Actually, they aren't more frequent; they just seem that way when the news is always bad, bad, bad!

A great friend was planning on retirement in the next year. His IRA losses will keep him working longer now. You been affected? Fortunately many of you live in those beautiful one story homes around town – so I needn't worry about you getting too hurt jumping out of a one story window.

Did anyone notice the price of gas is falling to near \$3? I didn't either until someone mentioned it to me. I guess our attention has been on other things.

But, something very important has gone unchanged: God still loves us more than we can understand; and He continues to provide for our every need – but that may not be in the form of a latté.

I'm too lazy to look it up, but our scripture asks us why we store up earthly things that die, peal, rot, disintegrate, erode, corrode and generally fall apart; when God offers us life Eternal if we will only believe in Him.

The work of ministry brings people to the realization that God will protect and guide us in everything we do – as long as we are doing God's will. The economic times we face today will affect most people much more adversely than it will affect us. Why? Because we faithfully have our course set on Him and not on us – because we know our treasure is stored up in Heaven – because we know we are His, and He is ours.

The people of our community will face difficult times, and though they may not know it

yet, their true salvation, the true peace, their unfailing wealth lies in Jesus Christ. We will invite them in. They will come on their own.

And I promise, they will come!

We need to be ready. We know we can be very welcoming to 2, or 3, or 4, or 6 guests on a Sunday. How would we do with 10, or 15, or 20? Are we ready for them?

I mean, are you ready to be excited about God's work in your life?! In this time of economic trial, are you ready to be exuberant about the blessings God has showered upon you? Am I ready to put God first – and "me" somewhere on down the list?

The Scriptures tell us how to stay in shape spiritually so that our lives can be complete:

- Grow in our prayer life. Pray unceasingly, praising God for his wondrous works and for His guidance, assurance, healing, and presence in our lives; and the lives of those around us.
- Grow in our Scriptures. Study His word – it is the standard upon which we are to judge all things and all matters under heaven. The Bible is the Operating Manual and Troubleshooting Guide for man (that includes you gals too.)
- Grow in your giving. Jesus lifts up the importance of the tithe to the teachers and Pharisees (Matt 23:23), when He berated them for ignoring justice, mercy and faithfulness. In <u>these</u> tough times, we should not neglect the "former things."

And my IRA? You know, it may not be there when I need it – but God will be.
